Andrew Ezra 'Tex' Rogers

Kent resident Andrew Ezra "Tex" Rogers died Nov. 30, 1992. He was 91.

Mr. Rogers was born Feb. 17, 1901, in Ramey, Okla. He owned and operated a cotton farm and a grocery store in Texas, and he also owned and operated a tavern in California. After his retirement, he was a cashier at a salvage company near his home in California. Mr. Rogers lived at his son's home in the Kent area for the past 16 months. He enjoyed fishing, horse races and telling his grandchildren about the "good old days."

He was preceded in death by his wife, Serentia, in 1929. Survivors include his son, Terrell Rogers of Kent; a daughter, Iva (Wendy) Divelbiss of Kent; five sisters, Johnnie Howard of Bryon, Texas, Hattie Ruff of Modesto, Calif., Rosie Buck of Chowchilla, Calif., Eliza Harp of Chowchilla, and Frances Gates of Lemoore, Calif.; 12 grandchildren, 30 great-grandchildren and four great-great-grandchildren; and numerous nieces and nephews.
